

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") is made and entered into effective as of March day of _____, 2011 by and between the Global Justice Initiative (the "GJI") whose address is Washington, D.C., USA and the International Academy of Matrimonial Lawyers, USA Chapter (the "IAML - USA"), whose address is _____.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the GJI is a Washington, D.C.-based 501(c)(3) not-for-profit organization dedicated to promoting access to justice, and the protection and empowerment of underserved, vulnerable and marginalized populations;

WHEREAS, the IAML - USA is a worldwide association of practicing lawyers who are recognized by their peers as the most experienced and expert family law specialists in their respective countries;

WHEREAS, the GJI and the IAML - USA desire to better coordinate their efforts and activities and explore ways to further cooperate.

AGREEMENT

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing, the GJI and the IAML - USA agree as follows:

1. Term.

The term of this MOU will begin upon signature from both parties and will last for three (3) years, unless earlier terminated upon written notice of the IAML - USA to the GJI or the GJI to the IAML - USA, as the case may be. This MOU may be renewed at the conclusion of three (3) years upon agreement of both parties.

2. International Family Mediation Program


GJI is in the initial stages of designing a pilot program, and anticipates that it will seek funding and initiate the pilot program in the coming year or two, with a goal to establishing a comprehensive full-service mediation referral network. As part of this pilot program, GJI is establishing a set of best practice standards in mediating international abduction cases, creating screening mechanisms to appropriately place cases with competent mediators, creating a training program for mediators and support staff, establishing a mediator referral list to handle cases across the United States, and establishing a comprehensive evaluation procedure to ensure the highest quality of GJI's mediation program. The IAML - USA will provide experts with mediation and international family law experience in helping GJI reach its goal.

3. Marks Usage.

Each of the IAML - USA and the GJI will use the other's marks, logos, and related items in a manner consistent with the owner's usage protocol.


